Dear Mr. Dastikas,

Thank you for your reply to our letter of 6 September 2010. We appreciate the will that Lifosa has shown to reply to all our 4 questions, but are highly concerned about the scope of the trade as you have explained in answer number 3.

The fact that your firm has made no consultation with the Sahrawi people, underlines our concern of the ethically problematic aspects of the trade, and supports our claim that it takes place in violation both of the international law and right to self-determination for the people of Western Sahara as described in the mentioned 2002 UN Legal Opinion, as well as, by consequence, the Global Compact's principles on human rights.

The information you have now provided us with, opens up for a series of new questions. The most crucial for us, and one that we hope you will answer, is the following:

*Will Lifosa/Eurochem follow the example of other ethically oriented fertilizer producers internationally and terminate its imports of phosphate from Western Sahara?*

We would also just make one remark regarding the volumes you have imported from Western Sahara. Considering the scope of the imports from Western Sahara, and thus the relative importance that the Western Sahara imports must have for Lifosa's total fertilizer production, we question the fact that the source of origins of the phosphate, and the human rights implications it entails, is not even mentioned in the CSR report of Eurochem of neither 2008 nor 2009, that were both submitted to the UN Global Compact.

Looking forward to hear from you regarding our question.
