– EDITORIAL –

Welcome to the COP of Action

The Paris Agreement was adopted in December 2015 at COP21. To enter into force, at least 55 Parties to the Convention, accounting for at least 55 per cent of global greenhouse gas emissions were required to deposit their instruments of ratification, acceptance and approval with the United Nations, with the Agreement then entering into force 30 days later.

On October 5, less than 10 months following its adoption, the threshold for entry into force of the Paris Agreement was achieved, and even surpassed. This demonstrates an unprecedented commitment from countries across the globe to tackle climate change and forge a clear path to a brighter, more prosperous and resilient future.

Following the entry into force of the Paris Agreement on November 4, COP22 is hosting the first session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Agreement (CMA 1), in conjunction with CMP12, the twelfth Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol.

COP22 will be an inclusive COP focused on the means to implement the Paris Agreement, linking Party and non-Party climate action, accelerating concrete initiatives and developing climate finance pathways for the world's most vulnerable countries to the impacts of climate change.

We have produced this guide to provide you with all of the information you will need to navigate the conference venue and participate in COP22.

The Kingdom of Morocco celebrates territorial climate diplomacy:

The Moroccan Association of Communal Council Presidents and the Association of Moroccan Regions, with major international networks of local and regional governments, will make the voices and proposals of global Mayors and Governors heard on the question of climate finance.

The Marrakech Summit for Local and Regional Leaders organized by the two Moroccan associations of Cities and Regions (AMPCC and ARM), is in line with Morocco's strong will to make this COP an international call to action.

The aim of this collective global enterprise is to include this event as a moment of truth for territorial climate diplomacy by demonstrating the continued "mobilization for action and impact" from local and regional governments and their networks following the First Summit of Local Elected Official in Paris in December 2015.

Territories: meeting needs, identifying potential, seizing opportunities

The Summit aims to communicate on the progress of networks, and on inspiring experiences of implementation by communities. It aims to:

> Advocate stronger empowerment of local authorities (legislative and regulatory frameworks, identifying financial expertise)
> The emergence of new sources of funding, including direct access to funding from the Green Climate Fund, but also addressing the whole range of available financing mechanisms (local, regional, public and private, grant or loan capital market via green bonds or savings, etc.)
> Identify partnership opportunities with strong potential which local authorities
> aspire to for building new financing mobilization strategies, including at a local level and the improved involvement of territorial stakeholders (citizens, companies, investors).

Fez Climate — Conscience Summit



November 3rd – Fez Marriott Hotel

The Fez Climate Conscience Summit is an event that aims to mobilize the ethical, philosophical and spiritual leaders of different backgrounds and diverse sensibilities through intercultural and high-level inter-faith dialogue to support the fight against the effects of climate change, based on shared and common values, in accordance with the Royal Message delivered on the occasion of the meeting on "Religious Minorities Rights in Muslim Countries" held in Marrakech on the 25th of January 2016, and where His Majesty King Mohammed VI, may God assist him, declared: "We need these common values not only to get inspiration from the ideal of tolerance that they carry, but also to draw from them the necessary resources for a renewed construction of human beings".

This event, organized by the Economic, Social and Environmental Council of the Kingdom of Morocco in collaboration with the Rabita Mohammadia of Oulemas, will be held in Fez on November 3rd, 2016 and follows the Summit of Consciousness held in Paris on July 21st, 2015.

The summit aspires to propose an approach to educate consciences, transmit intergenerational legacy and commit to the establishment of a common global awareness platform. It will aim to:

1. Develop the principles and roadmap for the implementation of a «Climate Awareness Platform» leading to a declaration of Fez;

2. Develop an initial «Theo Green Map»; a global, virtual, interactive map identifying theo-responsible actions and philosophical and religious experiences in favor of the environment;

3. Advocate in favor of the integration and sustainability of these tools by the Parties to awaken a shared environmental awareness in the fight against the effects of climate change. 21

Continuity of care and first aid are available throughout the chain links of urgent extrahospital medical care, covering the whole COP22 event;

Emergency Medical Assistance Service (SAMU-04) is the coordinator of extra-hospital interventions;

First aid is provided on-site at the fixed or mobile medical centers located in the Blue Zone and the Green Zone in Bab Ighli, at the accommodation sites and also during tours in Marrakech or to other cities;

Emergency Medical Assistance Service (SAMU) can be contacted for transport to hospital for a check-up or hospitalization;

40 SMUR ambulances and 2 SMUR helicopters are available to respond to medical emergencies;

Mobilization of hospitals for admissions to hospital services offering multidisciplinary care that complies with university centers of healthcare standards;

Hospitals with means enabling to combine round-the-clock medical-surgical services with interventional cardiology and medical imaging capabilities;

A special COP22 Epidemic Intelligence Unit is dedicated to the daily monitoring and data analysis to prevent and detect public health emergencies.

Services for Media at COP22

Media facilities in the Blue Zone

The Media Centre including an International Broadcast Centre is established in the Blue Zone, providing facilities to meet the needs of Television and Radio Broadcasters and Press News Agencies.

The Media Centre comprises two halls:

- Hall 1: TV and Radio broadcasts, the MCR, open-plan workstations and an area of 100 writing press desks.
- Hall 2: 500 writing press desks for journalists, reporters and correspondents.

The Plenaries and Press Conference Rooms are all within a short walking distance of the Media Centre.

Media facilities in the Green Zone

In the Green Zone, the COP22 steering committee will provide a dedicated area to journalists: "Dar Media". It consists of a workspace with numerous workstations, a debate area, a fully equipped conference room and a newspaper kiosk where media partners can display their productions.

Additionally, a Digital Media Zone (DMZ) hosted by PVBLIC Foundation is also set up in Dar Media. The DMZ works as a "social media news room" facilitating dialogue among conference participants through panel discussions, announcements of initiatives and projects and live interaction and reporting from COP22.

Languages, culture and religions

Morocco has two official languages: Arabic and Amazigh (Berber). Education and administration is conducted in classical Arabic and in French while everyday conversation is in the local Arabic dialect, "darija". Berber/Amazigh is spoken mainly in the Atlas mountains, Souss and Rif regions.

French and Spanish are the two languages spoken by most Moroccans. English is also commonly spoken in the country's international cities such as Marrakech, Rabat, Casablanca, Agadir and Tangier.

Islam is the Kingdom's main religion. However, Jewish and Christian communities practice their religion freely. In a city like Marrakech, mosques, synagogues and churches exist side by side throughout the city's various neighbourhoods.

Vaccinations

No vaccination certificate is required but it is recommended to protect against Hepatitis A & B as well as Typhoid.
